Poster presentation is the main mode. Outstanding abstracts will be recommended for ISSBD Conference in Lisbon 2024.

SPONSORSHIP

Early Career Scholars who wish to receive a travel scholarship will be required to apply by submitting an abstract of 250 words describing their current research work, a two (2) page curriculum vitae and a reference letter from a senior scientist who is familiar with their research. Applicants will be informed of the outcome of the selection process two months after the close of applications.


