We invite scholars, particularly early-career researchers, to submit abstracts for the 16th ISSBD African Regional Workshop. This year's workshop will focus on *Cultural Resilience and Responsive Interventions: Bridging Modernity and Indigenous Wisdom in Addressing Africa's Challenges*.

If your research aligns with the theme or sub-themes outlined below, we strongly encourage you to submit your abstract for consideration.





Sub-themes:

- Introduction to culturally based research approaches.
- Adopting interdisciplinary perspectives on intervention research (e.g., involving public health and developmental science experts)
- Bridging modernity and cultural response interventions to address climate challenges.
- Using cultural approaches to enhance inclusivity for youth with disabilities.
- Interventions in early childhood development as support for cultural identity.
- The role of Indigenous knowledge in sustaining cultural identity.
- Resilience, intersectionality, ubuntu, and social justice
- Safety, migration, economic issues, and youth involvement in Africa's search for interventions in creating resilient communities.
